Department for Education Vision for the Primary PE and Sport Premium

All pupils leaving primary school physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy, active lifestyle and lifelong participation in a physical activity and sport.

Objective

To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools. It is important to emphasise that the focus of spending must lead to long lasting impact against the vision that will live on well beyond the Primary PE and Sport Premium funding.

It is expected that schools will see an improvement against the following 5 key indicators:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick starting healthy active lifestyles
2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. Increased participation in competitive sport

Primary PE and Sport Premium at Ifield School

The school has three specialist PE Teachers who cover all the curriculum areas to provide equal access to a wide variety of high quality sports to every pupil. Pupils have the opportunity to learn sporting skills within the school as well as within the wider community. This gives all pupils the opportunity to be active and informed on healthy living and provides them with a healthy well-being. At present, we deliver three and a half hours of PE per week. One of these sessions is devoted to PE Enrichment where pupils may go offsite to experience activities such as Gymnastics, multi skills or Team Building in the school woodland. In addition, pupils have the opportunity to develop their trampoline skills or build their water confidence in the hydrotherapy pool coached by trained staff. As part of the CPD programme, we have staff trained as lifeguards and in rebound therapy to ensure that trampoline lessons are accessible for all pupils.

Ifield PE and School Sport is currently being developed further with the Primary PE and Sport Premium Funding. Our school received £8,336 for 2015/16. The key areas for development are Inter school competitions and healthy living & wellbeing. Pupil wellbeing is measured each week using the Leuven Scale. Records show that wellbeing levels are raised during the activity as the term progresses with pupils enjoying and engaging more as they experience more.

Competitions & Healthy Living & Wellbeing

There are eleven interschool competitions throughout the year and range from boccia to cross country. Results are shared in assemblies, on the PE noticeboard and on the school website. We currently have pupils who are members of the Under 12 Gravesham Borough Disability Football team who train every weekend and compete once a month in a league. Ifield took part in numerous competitions. Boccia, Sports hall athletics and Infant Agility were some of the competitions with mainstream schools through the Take Pride Partnership. It was a good opportunity for our pupils to integrate with mainstream pupils and be part of the schools community. Ifield won one of the Boccia competitions and gained some second and third places in athletics. The school came 4th in the Disability Tag Rugby tournament and won some matches in the football league coming 3rd overall.

Ifield has been awarded a Bronze for the Schools Games Mark and is working towards a Silver Mark. The school currently holds the Healthy Schools Enhancement Mark which endeavours to improve the health and wellbeing of pupils and staff. The school has five Change for Life Ambassadors who help to deliver weekly tips on how to live a healthy lifestyle. Our Sports Leader Programme in the Secondary department has created more opportunities for competition in the primary classes which help to teach pupils the values of fair play, behaviour in sport as well as respect and friendship.
