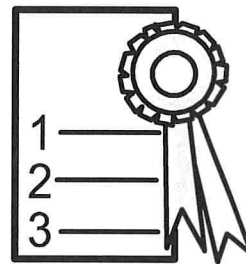
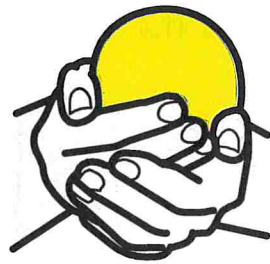


Ifield School

and stay safe.

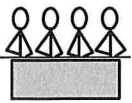


? What is this?

and know where to get help if they are worried or unhappy.



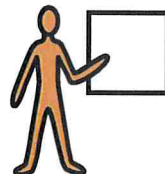
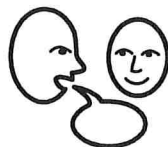
Staff and visitors



All staff and visitors to our school have to sign in at the office

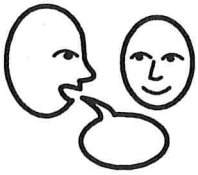


and wear a lanyard. Tell an adult if you see someone in school



who is not wearing the correct lanyard.

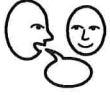




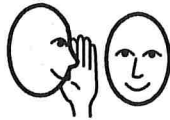
If you need to talk - we will listen



You can talk to any adult in school if you are worried.



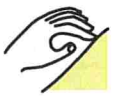
Do not keep it a secret!



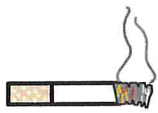
Do not keep it secret if someone is:

Trying to give you tablets, cigarettes or alcohol



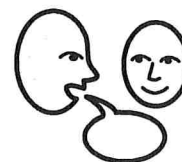
Hitting you or hurting you
