


Watch and Explore Together

Any films about space or the solar system are a good watch this term. Here are some suggestions:



Horrible Histories – Moon Mayhem - contains a lot of information presented in an accessible way. If you can stand the toilet jokes this is a good one to watch together.



Go on an evening walk together. These are the constellations that will be in the sky over the UK in February and March. The full moon is on March 7th and the new moon is on March 17th. Students can also explore constellations in a sensory way, making constellations out of beads, play-doh balls, or water beads. If using beads or water beads please make sure these are not swallowed, inhaled or put in ears or up noses.
