Parent and Carer Survey Results 2022- 2023

Thank you to parents and carers who completed our annual survey last academic year. Your feedback is very important and helps our school to continue to develop further.

We received 26.3% responses from parents and carers and therefore the results below are based on 70 responses out of a possible 266.

- 1. 75.7% of parents/carers agree that my child is happy at Ifield School.
- 2. 67.1% of parents/carers agree that my child is safe at Ifield School.
- 3. 62.9% of parents/carers agree that my child achieves well at Ifield School.
- 4. 64.3% of parents/carers agree that *Ifield School has high expectations for my child.*
- 5. 64.3% of parents/carers agree that *Ifield School makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year.*
- 6. 71.4% of parents/carers agree that there is a good range of subjects available to my child at Ifield School.
- 7. 68.6% of parents/carers agree that *Ifield School supports my child's personal development*.
- 8. 67.1% of parents/carers agree that when I have raised concerns with Ifield School they have been dealt with effectively.
- 9. 75.4% of parents/carers agree that Ifield School is a welcoming and pleasant place to visit.
- 10. 75.7% of parents/carers agree that *I would recommend Ifield School to another parent*.



The Cedar Federation Governing Body

Ifield School is federated with King's Farm Primary School and both schools form one Governing Body. There are currently 12 Governors on the Full Governing Board of The Cedar Federation, which has the following Committees:

- Finance and Resource Management
- Leadership, Strategy and School Improvement
- Teaching, Learning and Assessment

The Governor role involves working closely with the Headteachers of both schools at a strategic level and the Governing Body has three strategic core functions:

- Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction
- Holding leaders to account for the educational performance of the organisation and its pupils, and the effective and efficient performance management of staff
- Overseeing the financial performance of the organisation and making sure its money is well spent.

As well as attending meetings, Governors regularly visit both schools and Ifield Sixth Form looking at many aspects, including safeguarding, Health and Safety and join celebration events.

We are currently looking to appoint two new Parent Governors and would be delighted to hear from any parent who has:

- An interest in the performance of the schools
- A desire to contribute to and represent the community
- An open and enquiring mind
- The ability to look at school matters objectively
