

Rhymes / Songs Have lots of fun playing together with your child with their favourite toys this will help with their communication, vocabulary and engagement.

Literacy

During our Literacy focus we will share sensory nursery rhymes, including Humpty Dumpty and Incy Wincy Spider We will enjoy familiar songs and rhymes, learning actions and using visuals to help us communicate. We will explore lots of mark making both inside and in our garden area using a range of different tools and media.

Numeracy

During our Maths focus sessions we will be exploring maths concepts, focusing on building towers using a wide range of different resources. We will be learning to count blocks whilst building to develop our understanding of number. We will also be learning to request 'more' and follow objects when they disappear.

Understanding the world

This Term we will be learning to explore different materials with a range of familiar adults and peers which will include mud, water and bricks.

We will be exploring a range of natural objects and repeating actions that have an effect e.g. knocking down towers, clapping with mud, splashing in puddles.

Fine Motor Skills

Cedar Class will have lots of opportunities this term to develop our fine motor skills through the use of tools and different apparatus. We will be developing our pincer grip to pick up small objects. Whilst exploring appropriate clothing for different kinds of weather, Cedar class will be developing their self-help skills by using zips and buttons.

Expressive Arts and Design

Cedar Class will be exploring objects using a range of different body parts. We will be learning to play and manipulate different materials with increasing independence e.g. water, mud and bricks.

Fun With Foods

Foods can cause anxieties for our pupils with ASD. Cedar Class will be following the Fun with Food programme to help develop your child's tolerance of different smells and textures.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

Cedar Class continue to develop awareness of our daily routines and expectations, as well as building positive relationships. This term we will be focusing on learning to accept support when we are feeling frustrated or sad. Through a range of nursery rhymes, we will begin to develop our anticipation and excitement.

Physical Development

Physical Development takes place every day with a focus each Thursday. Swimming will be on a Monday morning. We are continuing to develop our confidence in the water.

To develop our fine motor skills we will be building towers and completing insert puzzles.

Communication/Language

Personalised Speech and Language targets haven been created to enable early communication. These include initiation, nursery rhymes, Curiosity Programme, Attention Autism, EHCP targets, 1-1 interventions, TAC PAC and Intensive Interaction

Music

Cedar Class will be enjoying music sessions where we will be learning to respond to music and follow simple instructions. We will explore lots of different instruments and notice the sounds they make.
