Pupils will examine differences between things that are living, dead or have never been alive. They will also expand their knowledge about some of the plants and animals in a familiar habitat. We will explore microhabitats and learn about its residents and their importance in our eco-system.	This term we will be continuing to learn about how to be safe online. We will be exploring how to research using laptops. We will look up times and days that shops are open such as Pets at Home and the Aquarium at Millbrook Garden Centre.
Art and Design & Technology In our Art, Design & Technology this term we will be looking at developing our imagination and skills to create sculptures of sea creatures. We will learn about the Marine life artist 'Jenny Berry'.	Food Tech This term we will be making a variety of healthy soups including vegetable, tomato and pasta soup. We will continue to develop our cutting and grating skills and knowledge of how different vegetables grow.	Geography In Geography we will be learning about the continents and oceans of the world. We will develop our skills on how to use maps, atlases and globes. We will begin to be able to identify key physical features, including: beaches, cliffs, oceans and rivers.	PSHE (Personal, social and health education) and RSE This term we will be continuing to work on our turn taking skills, and congratulating our friends when they win a game. We will also be learning about respect and relationships. We will identify what being respectful in school is.
