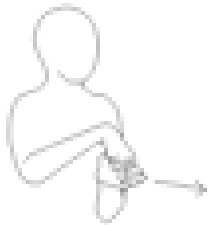

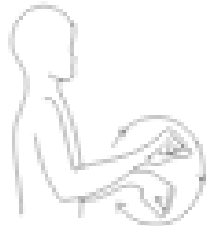


Our topic this term is "Reaching New Heights", here are some related signs for you to practice.

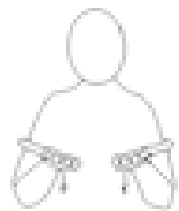

Intensive interaction, sensory circuit and sensory stories are daily interventions which meet students sensory needs and develop communication and interaction skills.



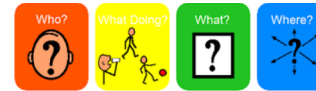
Digital Skills

Owl class will demonstrate an understanding of the concept of transaction (e.g. by exchanging a coin for an item, or one item for another, during a role-play activity)



Communication

Students will use communication boards to support their requests for items. There will be a personalised focus on Speech and Language targets to facilitate communication with a range of communication partners.



Foundations for Maths

Owl student will develop their counting like behaviours when moving/jumping etc. They will explore addition and subtraction along a number line physically and explore 2D and 3D shapes.



EAD

Owl class will develop their understanding of different movements associated to various forms of music.



Foundations for Literacy



Students will continue to develop their communication and literacy skills. They will explore making a 'list' of what they want to do tomorrow. They will link it to this terms topic "The Magical Yet" by Angela DiTerlizzi

Employability

Students will identify a job they would like to do. They will respond to verbal, physical and pictorial instructions with encouragement when following a work-related activity



Physical Education:
