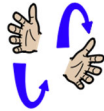


Core signs for our topic this term.

Interventions

Intensive interaction, sensory circuit and sensory stories are daily interventions which meet students sensory needs and develop communication and interaction skills.



Digital Skills

We'll be encouraging students to communicate in different ways, from using their talkers and creating marks on digital devices to taking part in fun roleplay activities—like making a telephone call to our class.



Communication

Students will use communication boards to support their requests for items. There will be a personalised focus on Speech and Language targets to facilitate communication with a range of communication partners.



Foundations for Maths

In Maths this term, students will continue developing their early number skills. We will be exploring number bonds to 3, 5, and 10 by making pairs of numbers, and the children will use visuals and manipulatives to help deepen their understanding.

EAD

Students will continue to share activities and work collaboratively with partners during Art. This approach helps to foster creativity, communication, and confidence as they explore a range of materials and techniques together.



Foundations for Literacy



This term, students are learning to connect pictures in books with real-life objects—for example, recognising vegetables from story illustrations. They are also building their listening skills during shared reading and practicing by drawing and labelling pictures.

Employability

This term, we will also be focusing on planning for the future, helping pupils develop the skills and confidence they need as they begin thinking about their next steps.



Physical Education:

This term, students will be developing a range of athletic skills through fun and energetic activities. They will take part in speed bounce, overhead throws, push throws, standing long jump, and running events.



Preparation for Adulthood

This term, our focus is on helping students build independence by learning key skills for shopping for clothes. They will practise identifying appropriate clothing for the weather, recognising sizes, choosing items they like, and gaining confidence making simple purchasing decisions.

PE Enrichment

Students will take part in various activities throughout the school year. This term students are going Ice skating
