General Information

English:

This term in English we will be continuing our spelling and handwriting programme using the Spelling Shed scheme looking at a range of sounds and strategies to support us in independently spelling. We will continue to practice using a handwriting pen to improve our letter legibility.

In SPAG sessions we will be exploring apostrophes in a range of contexts, we will also be looking at tenses and how we can up level our sentences in our writing and spoken language.

In English lessons we will be creating imaginative stories considering our story 'The Snow Dragon' embedding what we have learned into our writing. We will also read 'A Place Called Home' where we will do some fact writing and create our own magical homes!



Maths:

Our two maths groups will be continuing their learning and moving on to the next topic on the White Rose programme. Group 1 will continue with fractions before moving on to mass and capacity. Group 2 are starting length and then moving to mass, capacity and temperature.



Guided Reading

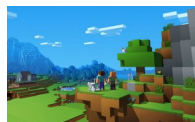
Pupils in Heron class will access a daily Guided Reading session after their lunch time break. This will include group and individual reading opportunities, comprehension tasks as well as the use of Typing club software to upskill our touch typing skills.

Science:

During Science this term we will be exploring everyday materials, looking at a range of materials what they are used for and what makes them a good material for their uses. We will explore properties of the materials which makes them useful for their uses.

Computing:

This term in Computing we will be using our programming skills to create animations and games, students will develop their own creations then reflect and adapt their work to create a desired outcome.



Art

In Art, we will be exploring the Dutch artist Van Gogh exploring the patterns and style he used in his paintings. We will be critically responding to his paintings and developing our own landscape paintings designs considering Van Gogh's style.



PSHE and RSE:

In PSHE, we will continue to engage in the 'This Is Me' wellbeing project alongside our SALT representative. We will complete the academic year by assessing students' understanding of mental wellbeing, health prevention and online expectations.

Physical Education:

In preparation for Sports Day, students will finalise the events they will be taking part in and ensure they are ready for the day ahead. Following this, we will complete our academic year in PE by focusing on striking and fielding games, as well as racquet sports. This will include activities such as tennis, badminton, volleyball, 20/20 cricket and rounders, to name just a few.

Religious Education

This term, we will be reflecting on and reviewing the religious knowledge and experiences we have explored throughout the year. We will examine the meaning of signs, symbols, artefacts and actions, and consider how these support worship in different religions. We will also be exploring the impact that music has on religion and its believers.

Geography

In Term 6 in Geography Heron class will be looking at European countries and comparing and contrasting them to our local area in the UK. We will be exploring a variety of cultures, food, dress and history and making links between these countries.

Music

Pupils will continue to learn about different song forms; they will have the opportunity to compose their own song using ternary form. Pupils will have opportunities to develop their music technology skills using GarageBand.
