

Suggested Uses of Information Technology Photo Cards

- Use on display to illustrate wider use of information technology.
- To initiate discussion.
- Provide pupils with the images and the labels separately and challenge them to identify each object.
- Ask pupils to sort the photos into groups, e.g. home, machinery or communication.
- Write a sentence to describe how each object makes use of information technology, e.g. a car has digital displays to show speed and fuel levels.
- Write a sentence to describe what each object does, e.g. the refrigerator keeps food cold and stops bacteria growing.
- Partner A describes the object in the photo and Partner B has to guess what the object is.
- Carry out a class survey to identify how many of the objects in the photos are used by the class and how frequently.
- Ask pupils to think of more items which use information technology.
- Ask what object would pupils find hardest to live without and would this object change for different family members.
- Use to stimulate creative writing, e.g. the day the machines broke down.
