Show the children the front cover. What is it? What is the title? What can you see? What could it be about? <u>Peace at Last - YouTube</u>

Activities –

Matching character boards (both matching symbols). Where is \_\_\_\_\_?

Matching story illustrations with symbols - What is it?

Describe the character – matching symbols with which character it could describe.

## <u>Topic</u>

**Monday** – Look at the body parts sounds PowerPoint. What sounds can you make using certain parts of your body? Can we record it?

**Tuesday** - To sort instruments into groups/categories.

What is our topic? ('What's that Sound?') What does it mean?

What instruments can we use? What do they sound like? How can we play them? Can we use any of the words from our 'What's that Sound?' display?

**Wednesday** – What animal is it? What's that? Match the animal photo with the symbol.
