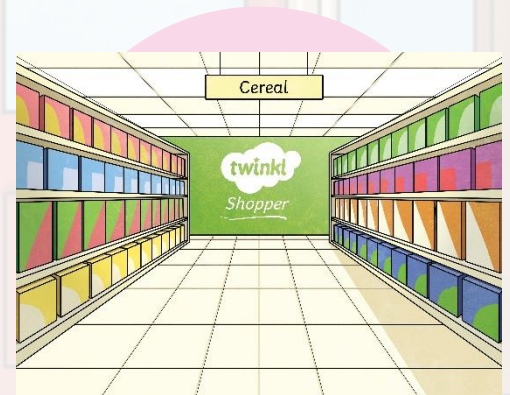


Going to the Shops

Read your list.

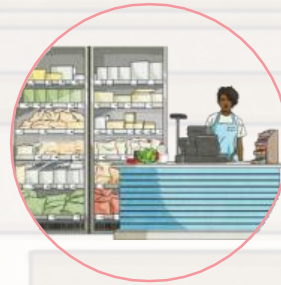
Find the items in the shop.

Going to the Shops Checklist

Take your basket to the checkout.

Place your shopping in a shopping bag.

Pay for your shopping when the shop assistant tells you to, using your cash or a card.

Wait for your change if needed.

Take your receipt.

Say 'thank you' to the shop assistant.

Take your shopping and leave the shop.
